

# Pre-Law Application Timeline



Applying to law school is a process that takes time and preparation. For the most competitive law school application, use the guide below to begin preparing at least two years before you plan to start law school.

## Fall of Junior Year



Begin studying for the LSAT.



Create an LSAC Account.



Visit law schools.



Attend LSAC forums.



Apply for LSAC fee waiver (if qualified).



Take several practice LSATs.

## Spring of Junior Year



Visit law schools.



Take several practice LSATs.



Register for the LSAT by February.



Request letters of recommendation.



Begin personal statement.



Start CAS application.

### Summer Between Junior & Senior Year



Begin resume.



Work on personal statement.



Request transcripts for CAS.



Have personal statement reviewed.



Have resume reviewed.



Take the LSAT in June (ideal timing for your application).

### Fall of Senior Year



Collect application fee waivers from colleges.



Submit Application by Oct. 1 for best chance at scholarship consideration.



Submit an application addendum end of semester (if necessary).
