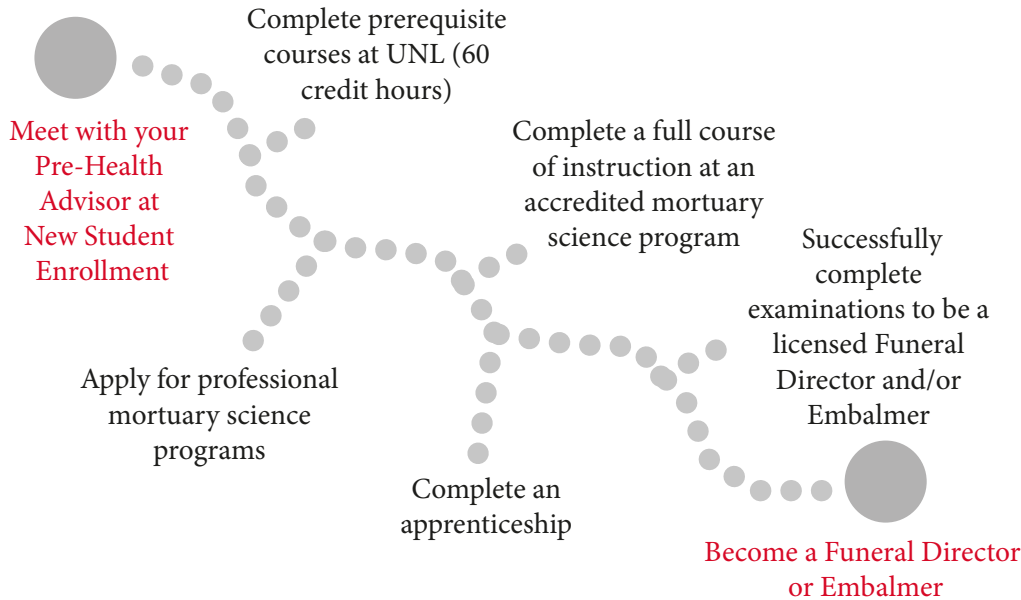

WHAT IS PRE-MORTUARY SCIENCE?

Pre-Mortuary Science is the track for a career as a funeral director and/or embalmer. The funeral director counsels families and next of kin with regard to the funeral service and the burial, disposition, or cremation of a deceased human body. The funeral director may also maintain a funeral establishment. The embalmer prepares deceased human bodies for funeral services and obtains burial or removal permits. Pre-Mortuary Science students work one to one with an advisor to reach their goals, and they do not need to choose a major while at Nebraska.

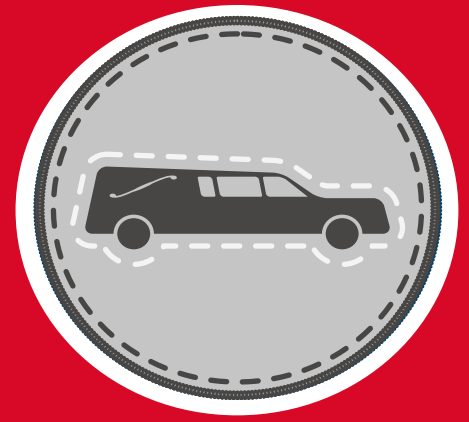

Note: Since students attending a mortuary science program will earn an associate's degree, a baccalaureate degree from UNL is not required prior to admission. UNL offers coursework required at the undergraduate level as specified by the State of Nebraska licensure requirements for funeral directing and embalming. These hours must be earned in addition to a full course of instruction in a school of mortuary science; hours earned as part of the mortuary degree or diploma cannot be used towards meeting these 60 hours.
